ALL THINGS BEAUTIFUL by Susan Newman





station. I also had much interest in the electronics part of it and spent a lot of time hanging around doing odd jobs. Since most of the staff wanted off on Saturdays, Joe Lee the station manager and after his career the CEO of Darden Foods, allowed me to fill in and that's when the Radio Bug bit. I continued to hang around and finally, when I graduated from High School, I signed on with the radio station the very next morning.

While my classmates went on a class trip, I went to work. It was a great time to get into radio, AM Radio was king. We did not have FN Radio yet. Who could ask for a better job than to be a D.J. during the days of "Rock n Roll"? Being on the air was a lot of fun with so much work to be done. A stack of 3-reel-to-reel machines, and turntables. We got our news and weather from the teletype machine from either the Associated Press or United Press. I was on air during the time of JFK and his assassination. I still have the original news bulletin from the Teletype, a very sad day for America. The programming during those days would be Block programming, country music from sign-on until 9 A.M., easy listening until 11 A.M., Southern Gospel until 1

I got interested in radio during my senior year at BHS. I lived close to the new AM radio station in 1962 that had recently gone on the air. The station was WBSG at 1350 KC, a daytime-only

> P.M., Country until 3 P.M. and after school is out, it's time for Rock n Roll. Also back in those days, the FCC required that every Radio Station have an engineer with a first-class FCC License. With the management's suggestion, M.L. Dixon, I attended Radio Engineering Institute in Sarasota Florida to complete all requirements and testing for the FCC License. I worked for Mr. H.L. Dixon for several years and learned a lot from him. He was a superb salesman. We even put together the Blackshear Tobacco Radio Network. I did a 15-minute program and fed it daily on the phone line to the stations in Waycross, Jesup, Baxley, and Alma. That's when editing was done via scissors, razor blades, and scotch tape. My first football play-by-play season was in 1963. I still have a tape of the BHS/Patterson game. Since I never played football, it was a really quick learning experience. That season was done jointly with Joe Lee. We recorded games on Friday night with live commercials and playback on Saturday morning. I can say as years went by I got better at it. During this time there were not many press boxes so sometimes we had a platform or would sit in stands on the homeside.

PIERCE COUNTY TEAM A WINS SGSC HIGH SCHOOL MATHEMATICS TOURNAMENT

Team A from Pierce County High School captured first place in South Georgia State College's High School Mathematics Tournament hosted February 23 on SGSC's Waycross Campus.

A total of 74 students from Brantley, Coffee, Pierce, and Ware Counties participated in the two-part competition. The first part included each student completing a 75-minute, 40-question multiple choice exam. The exam covered topics in the high school curriculum – algebra, trigonometry, geometry, and calculus. Cody Page of Ware County High School captured first place. Chase LeFevre (Pierce), Camille Hendry (Pierce), Grayson Rockett (Coffee), and Clark Stovall (Pierce) rounded out the top five individual winners.

Recognition was also given to those students who had the highest exam score from their school. Luke Carter (Brantley), Grayson Rockett (Coffee), Chase LeFevre (Pierce), and Cody Page (Ware) were the high scorers for their respective schools.

The top two scoring teams from each school based on the written exam competed in a team-oriented "ciphering round." The teams were given the same ten questions and three minutes to answer each one. The number of points awarded was determined by how fast the teams could answer each question correctly.

A combined score from the written exam and the ciphering round determined the overall team winners. In addition to Pierce County Team A, other team winners were Ware County Team A (second place), Pierce County Team B (third place), Brantley County Team A (fourth place), and Coffee Team B (fifth place).

Diane Griffis and Becky King of Pierce County were presented with the Dr. Barbara Losty Coach Award. The award is named in memory of the second president of the former Waycross College.
